To explore this issue, a study published in MDPI included 10 fleet managers and 174 heavy vehicle drivers. A fleet safety audit survey was administered, and both descriptive analysis and scoring were used to assess safety performance. Results showed ten companies fell below best practices, one performed far worse, and only one successfully met the standard.

The findings revealed that most companies rely on similar safety measures, including inconsistent driver training and annual maintenance. However, they often lack structured, proactive approaches to ensure comprehensive safety management. Research consistently shows that transport companies with a [strong safety culture](#) also show lower crash numbers. This highlights the importance of both leadership and frontline behavior in shaping safe driving outcomes.
